Upgrade to maternity bereavement suit at DGH Specially designed work by a local artist, Stephanie Russell Snyder, has been included in the upgraded bereavement suite at DGH. The project has been funded by NHS Grampian Charity, as well as the charities Sands and MISS.

Investing in the suite is part of our commitment to the National Bereavement Care Pathways. With a longstanding commitment to person-centered and trauma informed approaches to supporting pregnancy loss, we are part of a Scotland-wide pilot project to improve the care and experiences of women and families.

Marcia Dean, who is based in Elgin, is one of two bereavement specialist midwives who work alongside staff providing clinical care to bereaved families across the Grampian area. She said: "We are very lucky to have the support of people like Stephanie, who volunteered to provide a specially designed art piece for our walls, as well as local representatives from the Sands and MISS charities. The upgrade vastly improves our bereavement room for families, making it a more friendly and comfortable place to spend time as a family with their baby."

The design of the facility also takes in some of the carefully thought-out ideas which will feature at The Baird Family Hospital. Its design has been informed by a huge amount of community engagement work, carefully planning the layout and features.

International Infection Prevention Week This global campaign kicks off on Sunday. Staff Equalities Network – British Sign Language Do you want to find out more about British Sign Language (BSL)? Would you like to learn some simple words and greetings you can use in your in your daily life? Then the next meeting of the Staff Equalities Network, on Wednesday 18 October, between 2-3pm is for you!

It is estimated over 150,000 people use BSL as their primary or preferred language in the UK. This number includes both Deaf and hearing people, who may have learned to sign as part of their work or to communicate better with the Deaf people in their lives. The BSL (Scotland) Act 2015 makes requirements for public bodies such as ourselves to develop a BSL Plan and this work is coordinated by our interim Equality and Diversity Manager Roda Bird. During this session Roda will help you to better understand BSL and equip you with some everyday words you can practice and use to improve communication with Deaf / BSL colleagues, patients, and their families.
