## CAROLINE: IN CONVERSATION WITH...



This week Chief Executive Caroline Hiscox was joined in conversation by Scotland's National Clinical Director Jason Leitch in advance of his visit to Grampian. [Watch it here](#)

Caroline and Jason discuss a range of topics including how staff wellbeing can't just be about tokenistic gestures and needs to be meaningful, focusing on things that make a real difference to people like being able to finish work on time or being able to park close enough to work.

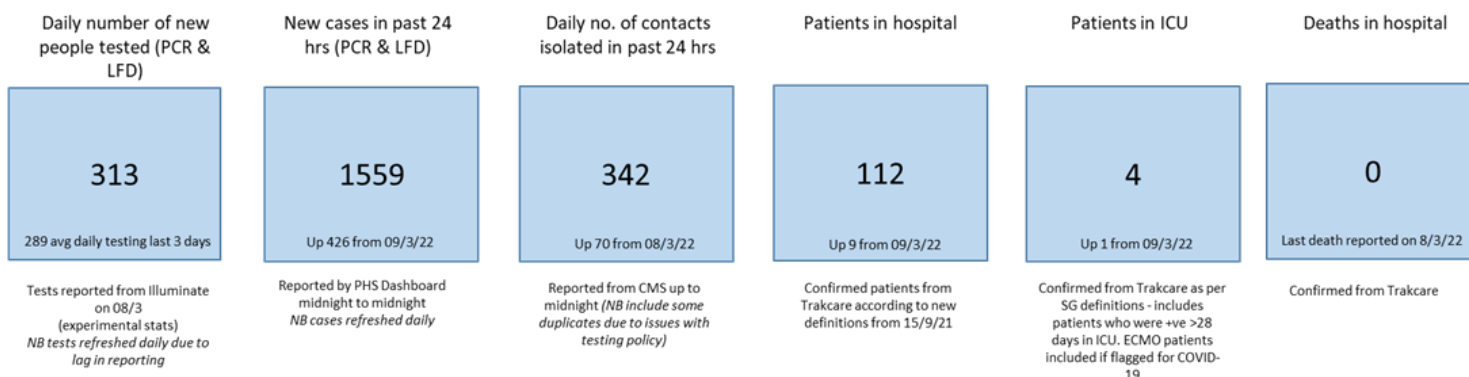

**M365 The Essentials webinars** As part of the ongoing development of the NHS Scotland M365 environment, NHS Grampian is one of several boards who will be migrating data from existing "on premises" file shares to modern cloud storage tools such as SharePoint Online and OneDrive. This will simplify access to data and enable a broader range of ways of working and collaborating with Microsoft 365. To raise awareness of these new applications, webinars for M365 The Essentials will be running throughout March, open to all NHS staff

**What's coming up?** The webinars will take place Tues afternoons and Thursday mornings, giving you insight into what cloud technology is and the applications you'll most likely use from the M365 suite to collaborate and work on documents. They will each last 90min and are a great way to learn about what's coming up in the next phase the enhancements to the M365 environment.

**What will the webinar include?** They will help you to:

- Understand the differences and benefits to working in the cloud
- Understand what to use when for the core applications
- Search, access, and pin M365 applications and content
- Understand the similarities and differences between working online and in the desktop applications
