## COVID-19Brief




Here is the brief for Friday 11 March 2022.

**System Update** This has been another challenging week according to the data and borne out by daily reports from operational staff working to keep care flowing across the system. Occupancy across almost all hospitals continues to operate at extremely high levels.

The number of beds available across the whole system is unchanged this week, but there are increasing trends in activity for medical non-elective and elective surgery. Covid continues to disrupt with cases increasing in the community by 30% over the past 7 days.

New admissions to hospital for covid and inpatient clusters means we had 113 patients in Grampian hospitals this morning compared to 135 at the highest ever peak on January 15, 2022. Despite the signs of spring, winter is not through with us yet.
