## COVID-19Brief



Here is the brief for Friday 3 December 2021.

Aberdeenshire Council Mutual Aid request – call for volunteers Aberdeenshire Council have made a further request for volunteers to assist with checks on vulnerable residents over the weekend. A separate email, with details of volunteer hubs and points of contact was circulated earlier. Please note, volunteers are required on Saturday 4 December and Sunday 5 December – apologies for the date error in the earlier email. Thank you to everyone who has supported this already, and to those who may be able to assist over the weekend.

**Maternity review, Dr Gray's Hospital** The Independent Review into maternity services at Dr Gray's Hospital was announced by the Scottish Government in March 2021. At the time it also announced that the report containing its findings would be produced for consideration by the Cabinet Secretary at the end of June 2021. The report has now been published and is available to view here.

We want to thank everyone for their patience during this review exercise. Although it was an external process, we acknowledge it has been lengthy and, whether you engaged directly with the review team or not, your forbearance is acknowledged and appreciated. We also appreciate the honesty of the women's stories in the report. Where they describe negative experiences, it's appreciated that women and families have shared these stories with us. It should also be noted that women have also shared stories which are very positive about the care they have received.

NHS Grampian has been fully supportive of the review process throughout, and we formally welcome its conclusion and thank those staff, including midwifery and nursing, that contributed to its findings. We look forward to working closely with the Scottish Government, our healthcare partners, and the population of Moray to find ways in which the recommendations contained within the review can be implemented.

Mon-Fri


SAS Patient Transport Service (PTS) is available for patients who are eligible – this can be booked through the priority booking line 03333 990044. In addition, Site & Capacity have access to private ambulance, man with a van and RVS volunteers. These resources can be booked on the day through Site & Capacity.

Weekend arrangements

Private ambulance is available through Site & Capacity Saturday and Sunday 10am – 11pm. Additionally, we now have SAS PTS cover at the weekend - this can be requested by calling 0345 602 3999. Please note the usual priority booking line is not available over the weekend so this is the A&E ambulance booking line. Please only call if you anticipate your patient will meet the eligibility criteria for SAS PTS. Where patients are eligible can we ask that wards please try and book transport through SAS before coming to Site & Capacity.
