## COCOND-19Brief

Here is the brief for Tuesday 3 May 2022.

**Further extension of hospital visiting** From tomorrow (4 May), the following wards/hospitals will be offering person-centred visiting (newly added areas are in italics):

Wards 102, 109, 112, and 114, Aberdeen Royal Infirmary

Paediatrics – RACH and Dr Gray's Hospital

Wards 4, 1, 5, 6, 8, Stroke ward and AMAU, Dr Gray's Hospital

Royal Cornhill Hospital, including Great Western Lodge and Polmuir Road

Roxburghe House

Woodend Hospital (all wards)

**Rosewell House** 

All Aberdeenshire Community Hospitals

Muirton ward, Seafield Community Hospital, Buckie


This means in these clinical areas there will be opportunity for patients to have an increase in the number of visitors they have on any given day. The general public are being advised changes to their visiting plans in these areas should not be made until they have had a conversation with the SCN, to ensure all visits can be safely accommodated. We are reminding visitors of the need to stay away if they are at all unwell (with symptoms of COVID-19 or any other infections) and that free LFD test kits can be ordered by hospital or care home visitors. We are also emphasising the use of Fluid Repellent Surgical Masks, in preference to fabric face coverings, and frequent hand hygiene during visits.

Those wards/hospitals not listed above should continue to support visits by a maximum of two people, per patient, per day.

**WhatsApp** All staff are reminded that WhatsApp is NOT approved – and should not be used - for either internal NHS business or communication with patients. This is due to both security and privacy issues with this platform.

**Smarter Workplaces** Guidance continues to be developed to support a move to hybrid working, with pilot areas testing out different approaches. As a reminder, we should continue to work at home where possible, while using this time to plan what hybrid working will look like for different teams/services. It may be helpful to take a look at this <u>Vision</u>, <u>Principles</u>, and <u>Enablers document</u> developed by the Smarter Workplaces team. This is also available in the Workplace Information section of the COVID-19 staff pages on the NHS Grampian website.

**Grampian data** The local update is shown below; <u>the PHS daily dashboard can be viewed here</u>. As noted in the chart below, changes to testing policy effective from 1 May will see a reduction in both the quantity and quality of testing data. As such, this is the last day we will share those figures.
