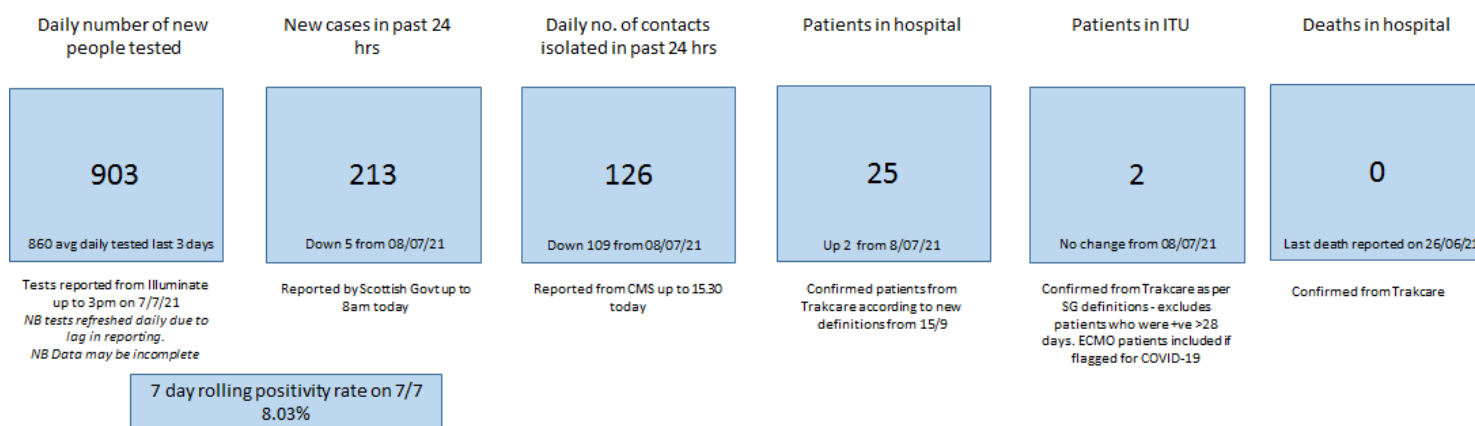


Here is the brief for Friday 9 July 2021.

HR Q&As At the start of the pandemic, a comprehensive Q&A was put together by the HR team. Grampian data Here is the local update for today, including the 7-day rolling positivity rate. As a reminder, this rate is arrived at by dividing the number of positive tests in the past 7 days by the number of tests carried out in the past 7 days. Repeat tests are included in both categories. The figure for the “daily number of new people tested” is only for the number of tests for people who have not been tested previously. As noted in the diagram below, we have been advised the testing data may be incomplete.

Executive Nurse Director appointment As announced earlier today, Dr June Brown has been appointed to the position of Executive Nurse Director for NHS Grampian. At the beginning of my career as a newly registered learning disability nurse I never imagined I would be in this position today. I’m very excited to bring my passion for person centred practice to this role.”
