Culture Matters survey If you took part in phase 1 of the Culture Matters survey, local reports have now been sent to your manager/supervisor/team leader. You should take the time in your teams to understand what the results mean for you and what your action plans will be as a result. There will be an opportunity for the rest of us working in Grampian to participate in phase 2 of the survey later this year. Snapshots of the results of phase 1 are being finalised and will be shared widely in the coming days.

Surgical Site Infection (SSI) Surveillance Mandatory Surgical Site (SSI) Surveillance was paused due to COVID-19 but will resume for caesarean section, planned colorectal, and vascular and hip arthroplasty from October. The Infection Prevention & Control team need your help to get ready for this.

When taking a wound swab/sample: (this should be applied to EVERY possible SSI)

- Please document fully and accurately on OrderComms/ICE don't just write '?Infection' what does this mean?
- Tell us the site: left leg, abdominal wound etc. some surgeries have more than 1 site!
- Complete the tick boxes with the clinical symptoms don't just say 'discharge'. If you see discharge, is it serous/purulent?
- Is the infection superficial/deep/organ space?
- Is your patient on antibiotics? Are they on the correct one? Tell us which one.
- Contact us if it's hard to explain tick boxes don't always cover every patient or circumstance.

Incomplete documentation means the IPC team have to contact teams individually to gather further information, when both your time and theirs could be better used.
