**Monkeypox – what you need to know** There has been growing coverage of this virus in recent weeks and confirmation today that a case has been detected in Scotland. It is really important to keep this in context; the overall risk to the public remains extremely low.

If you are interested in learning more, the <u>UK Health Security Agency</u> and <u>Public Health Scotland</u> are a good place to start. In addition, if you use Twitter, there are a number of academics sharing their thoughts, including Prof Helen Ward (Professor of Public Health, Imperial College London - @profhelenward), Conor Bamford (Virologist, Queen's University Belfast - @cggbamford), and Tanja Stadler (ETH Zurich - @TanjaStadler\_CH). This list isn't exhaustive, it merely reflects some of the expert opinion currently available.

**Care of scrubs – message from Linen Services** During the last financial year, Linen Services have regrettably received more than 5,000 sets of scrub suits/greens which have had to be condemned due to staining. In all cases ink stains were the culprit – on 474 occasions the scrubs had actually been written on. This has meant the organisation spent approximately £13,000 replacing otherwise functional sets of scrubs. In addition, waste has been sent to landfill unnecessarily. Please help the organisation and the environment by acting responsibly and not carrying pens in scrub pockets. Please also check pockets are empty before placing used greens in the laundry skip and sending to Linen Services.
