Further extension of suspended pension scheme abatement rules Some rules around pension scheme members returning to work after retirement from the 1995 section of the scheme – sometimes known as 'the 16-hour rule' - were suspended by the Coronavirus Act. This suspension was due to end on 31 October 2022 (this coming Monday). The suspension of this rule has been extended to 31 March 2025. The Pension Scheme Advisory Board will further consider this rule being removed permanently. The suspension of other rules around draw down for 2008 and 2015 scheme members who took partial retirement are also extended. Click here for more information.

To do both these things at the same time is quite literally the stuff of legend. Every day you showed up, when I am certain you would rather have been literally anywhere else. Wrapped in plastic for countless hours and what seemed like endless months, you tended the infirm and the unvaccinated, the strong and the unlucky. All of them alone and no one to hold their hand - except you. All day, what seemed like every day, and yet you still managed to find a smile behind your mask for each other and especially for those of us having a rough day. And we all had those days for they were many, frequent and dark. So, although it has been said before, it does not weaken the sentiment to say it again - thank you. Thank you for all that you did and continue to do. It has been a massive privilege to have worked with you these last few years and you all made my job much easier than it should have been. Thank you for standing up for our patients and each other when there was barely ever time to sit down. The Intensive Care Unit was never just a place – it is people. It is you."
