NHS G Remobilisation plan has a focus on embedding a Realistic Medicine culture

Establishment of a Realistic Medicine Programme Board with Exec Lead and Programme Management

System, Service and Clinical Leaders champion and create conditions for Realistic Medicine to be practiced

Clinicians have access to learning that incorporates the RM principles into lifelong learning and supports Shared Decision Making in their day to day practice

Clinicians & clinical teams utilise technology to support delivery of a Realistic Medicine approach in service delivery

Public & Staff awareness of a Realistic Medicine ethos and approach is raised through delivery of a Communication and Engagement plan

People have the information they need in multiple languages to enable them to engage in shared decision making

A co-design approach is taken to service planning

- Local H&SC service plans describe how services will deliver a RM ethos based on the 6 principles
- Departments /Services utilise the Atlas of Variation to report data against
- Establish Asynchronous Consulting across Secondary care services
- Embed the use of ARCT & PIR in Secondary care pathways
- Implement innovative technology –e.g. cytosponge, Colon Capsule Endoscopy.
- Undertake continuous review of practice.
- Using a pathway approach identify and reduce unwarranted variation in clinical practice within services and across the whole system
- Pursue a continuous quality improvement approach to manage risk better
- Promote the implementation of a shared decision making approach – encourage clinical staff to undertake the NES Shared Decision Making Module on Turas
- Embed BRAN questions into all forms of patient communication across Primary & Secondary Care
- Provide high quality patient information in different formats across Primary & Secondary Care
- Promote Self-care and Self-Management resources
- Offer virtual consultations (Near Me) where there is no clinical need for face to face consultation
