Message for laundry colleagues We're pleased to share a special message to all laundry colleagues today: <u>Caroline Hiscox video message to laundry team</u>. We also want to remind everyone the service remains in contingency and continues to receive support from other boards and external accredited laundries. How can you help?

- Be mindful around the use of linen (paper for spills, not towels)
- Scrubs only be worn by appropriate services, such as theatres
- Change beds only when needed, but ensure linen is changed within a seven-day window
- Be respectful to the team

The sewing room is open; if additional uniform is required, please requisition as normal. Your ongoing co-operation is welcome and a huge thank you to the laundry team for their continuing hard work.

Disposal of Medicine Pots Pots used to dispense medicines to patients are classed as medicinal waste and should be disposed of in blue bodied waste bins only. This applies whether the pot used is paper or plastic, and whether it was used to dispense liquid medicines, tablets, or capsules, as there may still be remnants of medicine in the pot. This also applies to medicine spoons and oral syringes. Catering colleagues are reporting many of these pots are being returned to the kitchens on meal trays. They do not have facilities to dispose of medicinal waste, so please ensure these pots are disposed of appropriately at ward level. Thank you for your co-operation, as always.

Aseptic technique training The proper application of aseptic technique is central to reducing HAIs and preventing infection linked to invasive devices.
